

## TRAVEL WINTER STUDY COURSE

### ENVI 25: Sustainable Eleuthera: Farming, Subsistence & Food Security

**Note:** This course differs slightly from the description in the course catalog: it will not be a hands-on gardening project, but a research study of the food system: farms and imports, production, home gardens, consumption, food expenditures, and food security. We will be carrying-out a group research project that will involve conducting surveys, talking with people (grocers, farmers, fisher-people, residents, children), conducting interviews and researching all aspects of the island's food system. We will also investigate nutritional issues and diet-related disease incidence. We will be working in cooperation with a community-based organization in Eleuthera. The class will create a short film as well as a written report about our project.
