

I am looking for a postdoc researcher in experimental economics and behavioral economics, broadly defined. Possible areas of interest include, but not limit to, pro-social behavior (e.g., cooperation, coordination, trust, charity), social preferences, social responsibility, teamwork, payment and incentive scheme, experiments and theory in personnel economics, subjective well-being, attitude regarding the role of government (e.g., redistribution, welfare, economic and social intervention), as well as applications of experimental & behavioral economics in business, organization, and public policy.

The position is immediately available, for two years, and will be based in the Southern University of Science and Technology, a fast-growing young university targeting world-class elite universities. The salary is close to the average level of oversea-trained assistant professor position in China, but with much more time for research. Eligible appointee can also apply for the generous allowance awarded by the government of Guangdong province and Shenzhen, a Chinese first-tier city of innovation connected to Hong Kong.
