

Liu Chunhang received his master and doctorate degrees in development studies from Cambridge University. He also received an MBA (Baker Scholar) from Harvard Business School.

He joined the China Banking Regulatory Commission (CBRC) in 2006 and has held various positions including Deputy Director-General and Director-General of the Statistics Department, and Director-General of the Policy Research Bureau.

Prior to joining the CBRC, Mr. Liu worked at Morgan Stanley, McKinsey & Company and the China Industrial Development Research Centre of Peking University.

Since 2011, he has been a member of the Standing Committee on Regulation and Cooperation of the Financial Stability Board, and has participated in the discussion and development of international financial reform policy after the financial crisis.

During 2012-2015, he was Chairman of the Leverage Ratio Working Group of the Basel Committee, responsible for the development of the Basel III leverage ratio standard. Since 2015, he has been the Chair of Supervision and Implementation Group of the Basel Committee.

His research interests include bank regulation, macroeconomic policy, economic theory and the structure of industrial value chains.
