Syllabus: Chapters 0-4 of the text are assumed to be prior knowledge; we will review them quickly at the start of the course. The bulk of the course will be devoted to covering Chapters 5, 10 - 14, and parts of 7 and 15.

Marking scheme:

Your mark will be calculated based on the following four components:

1. Weekly assignments -25%

These are to be turned within the first five minutes of your tutorial; late assignments will not be accepted. Your lowest *two* scores will be dropped before calculating the contribution to your final mark. Please note that numerical answers alone will not be given any credit, whether or not they are correct; you *must* show work to receive credit.

2. Weekly quizzes -25%

These will take place during tutorial. The problems will be drawn directly from the examples in the assigned reading (though with different numbers), and the quizzes will be 20 minutes long. As with the assignments, the lowest two quiz scores will be dropped at the end of the term.
